Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up

Large Spills: Stop the flow of material, if this is without risk. Dike the spilled material, where this is possible. Absorb in vermiculite, dry sand or earth and place into containers. Following product recovery, flush area with water.

Small Spills: Wipe up with absorbent material (e.g. cloth, fleece). Clean surface thoroughly to remove residual contamination. Used rags or other cleaning materials should be soaked with water and placed in a sealed container. Rags, steel wool, or waste contaminated with this product may spontaneously catch fire if improperly discarded.

Precautions for safe handling
